Rules and Regulations

Participation and Eligibility - There will be no age limit - however an adult must accompany persons under the age of 18. Only two (2) persons will be allowed per boat. The tournament committee reserves the right to refuse an entrant.

Entries - Entry fees will be per boat per tournament. MSBC reserves the right to refund or deny any entry fee.

2010 Early Bird Boat Position - Boat positions will be drawn for all early bird entrants first. Early bird entrants must pay for all four MSBC tournaments prior to May 1, 2010. Early bird entries qualify for Radisson/Three Rivers Lodge Challenge. Remaining boat positions will be in the order that completed entries are received.

Radisson/Three Rivers Lodge Challenge - Early bird teams will be bracketed in a head-to-head format with the winning teams moving on to compete for a La Crosse Radisson prize package.

2010 Application and Deadline - A complete and signed application form accompanied by your entry fee must be filled out. Entries received after the May 1, 2010 early bird date will be placed in boat position as entries are received. Entries received after the 7-day entry cutoff will be accepted with a \$25.00 late fee which will be donated to the MS Society. Sign up at the ramp is permitted but not encouraged as take-off will not be delayed for late entrants.

Substitutes and Cancellations - A team may substitute one member but not both. In the event neither team member can fish, the entry fee will not be refunded, but donated to the MS Society.

Fall Classic Bonus Bucks Qualification - Each team that enters all four qualifying tournaments will be eligible to win bonus bucks at the Fall Classic. A team may use one substitute or one buy-in and still qualify. The buy-in entry fee will be donated to the MS-Society and not included in that tournament payback. Teams must fish the Fall Classic with the same partners as the qualifying tournaments. \$1,000.00 sponsor bonus.

Sportsmanship - Each team is expected to follow a high standard of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety, and conservation. Any team failing to do so may be disqualified.

Alcoholic Beverages and Drugs - NO alcoholic beverages or other stimulants or depressants shall be allowed in the tournament boats or in the possession of contestants prior to check in or during the tournament hours. NO Exceptions!

Points - Determined on a 100 point system plus weight. Big fish weight will break point tie.

Tackle and Equipment - All fish must be caught in a legal and sporting manner by casting, flipping, or pitching. Intentional snagging of fish will not be allowed. No trolling is permitted with any motor. Only artificial lures may be used. No live bait or prepared baits permitted, with the exception of pork rinds. Liquid fish attractants are allowed. Only one (1) rod may be used at a time. Other rods may be in the boat and ready for use, however every cast and retrieve must be completed before another cast is made. The use of electronic tracking equipment cannot be used during competition.

Boats and Motors - There is no horsepower limit. No engine may exceed the BIA Horsepower rating for the boat that is used. All boats must meet US Coast Guard State regulations. All boats must have an emergency kill switch in working order and an aerated live well large enough to sustain a tournament limit in releasable condition. Extra gas tanks must be secured and must be US Coast Guard approved.

Life Jackets - Life jackets must be zipped or buckled. Kill switch must be attached to the life jacket of the boat operator while the combustible engine is in operation. All life jackets must be Coast Guard approved.

Rules - The following rules will remain unchanged throughout the event unless State or Local Laws are in conflict. Interpretation and enhancement of the rules will be left to the tournament committee. In the event of a rule violation, the committee may impose such sanctions, as they deem appropriate, including without limitation to, disqualification, forfeiture of prizes, entry fee and prohibition from participation in subsequent tournaments. The decision of the Tournament Committee shall be final in all matters. It is the committee's discretion to make changes where safety is concerned. All participants must comply with all Coast Guard, State and Local Regulations. Any competitor receiving a citation for violations of any Coast Guard, State, or Local regulations will be disqualified immediately. It is the contestant's responsibility to know these regulations.

Lockage: first in - first out - Period! Automatic Disqualification.

Permitted Fishing Locations - Fishing on the tournament waters - **Pools 7, 8, & 9** - is permitted anywhere except within 50 yards of any marina gas pump or within 50 yards of another competitor's boat which was first anchored. No such anchored boat shall permit selected competitors to fish within the 50-yard circle claimed by him to the exclusion of any other competitor. All angling must be done from the boat. Contestants must not depart boat to land fish. Both must remain in the tournament waters during the tournament day. Contestants must leave and return to the official checkpoint by boat. Both competitors must remain in the boat at all times except in case of emergency. Trailering of boats during tournament hours is prohibited.

Scoring - Each team may weigh in eight (8) fish with the minimum of 14 inches in length, measured on a flat board with mouth closed and tail compressed or fanned. A COURTESY BUMP BOARD WILL NOT BE PROVIDED. Tournament standings will be determined by the total weight caught during the competition. Only Largemouth or Smallmouth Bass will be scored. Any team weighing in a fish shorter than legal tournament length will be penalized two pounds. Any team returning to the checkpoint late will be DISQUALIFIED. LATE IS LATE. Dead fish will result in a one pound per dead fish penalty.

Pre-Tournament Check In - All teams must check in at the official check-in location, **Clinton Street West Boat Landing**, for live well and kill switch inspection.

Fishing Hours - Tournaments will run from 6:00 AM to 2:00 PM (SHARP). Check-in at the Clinton Street West landing.

Weigh In - Early weigh-in begins at 1:00pm at **Clinton St. West Boat Landing**. Weigh-in bags will be furnished and must be used by all contestants. Contestants will be responsible for their own catch from the boat to the check-in tub. All fish weighed in will be returned to the fished waters.

Ties - Ties between places will be determined by the team's largest bass recorded at the time of weigh in, then by a flip of a coin.

Insurance - Liability insurance is required on all contestants utilizing their boats in this tournament.

Protests - Must be brought to the Tournament Committee in writing not more than 30 minutes after the end of the tournament.

Big Bass Prize - There will be a 1st and 2nd place Big Bass pot. A single team cannot win both. In the event of a tie, 1st and 2nd place money will be combined and divided equally between the two teams.

MSBC Membership - Annual \$30.00 per angler membership fee. This fee will be used for administrative needs with any unused amount being donated to the MS Society. Each angler will get a membership benefits card and an MSBC sticker. **One name will be drawn at each weigh-in for a new fishing reel for those that raise a minimum of \$100.00 for the MS Society.** Stickers must be displayed on tow vehicle, boat, or trailer and be present at the weigh-in to win.
